





What safety measures are in place?

Throughout the event you will see and hear messages that encourage guests to follow the latest CDC guidelines, and we've transformed our program to reduce the risk while keeping the celebration fun and engaging. We have plenty of hand sanitizer, masks and other supplies available to reduce the spread.



Do I need to be vaccinated to volunteer?

The AHA encourages everyone to have a COVID-19 vaccine. It is not required to volunteer. If you are not vaccinated, please wear a mask when mingling and not at a table.



Do I need to wear a mask?

All unvaccinated attendees are asked to wear a mask when mingling and not eating or drinking, and vaccinated guests have the option of choosing whether to wear a mask. All attendees are encouraged to physically distance and wash their hands.



Am I responsible for ensuring guests follow the protocols?

Our volunteers do not need to worry about monitoring guests or asking whether they have been vaccinated. As always, if you are unsure how to handle a situation, please alert one of our staff members.
