Bertha was at work when she was suddenly overcome by dizziness, confusion and an excruciating headache. Unsure what was going on, a co-worker drove Bertha to a nearby emergency room. She was diagnosed with a bleeding stroke caused by a ruptured brain aneurysm and spent over three weeks in the hospital. She then faced a long recovery marked by memory loss, headaches and anxiety. Today, Bertha is doing well and deeply grateful for her family's unwavering support. Now, she's committed to giving back by offering hope and encouragement to other stroke and aneurysm survivors on their journey.

Dr. Bardia is an Interventional Cardiologist and a volunteer medical expert for the American Heart Association in Kern County. As a physician she wants women to know that heart disease doesn't always look dramatic. Subtle symptoms like fatigue, shortness of breath, jaw or back pain matter. It's important to listen to your body and speak up if something doesn't feel right. She adds, "Taking care of your heart isn't selfish; it's an act of strength and self-respect."

Emily Duran is the Chief Executive Officer of Kern Family Health Care and is passionate about expanding access to health care, educating the community about good health and well-being and advocating for underserved populations. She is leading the Go Red for Women movement in Kern County because she believes when women have the knowledge, resources and care they deserve, they not only survive, but thrive. Working alongside Go Red for Women, she wants to make sure that all women have a fair chance at a long and healthy life.

Maria and her husband were excited to grow their family when she became pregnant in 2022. But at 33 weeks, she developed shortness of breath and a persistent cough she thought was bronchitis. Despite treatment and a subsequent visit to the emergency room, her symptoms worsened. After symptoms failed to go away, a friend urged her to call 911. That decision saved her life. Tests revealed her heart was functioning at only 19%, she had pregnancy-related heart failure. At 36 weeks, Maria delivered a healthy baby girl, but her heart challenges continued.

Today, her heart function has improved, though she still lives with heart failure. Her advice to other women: trust yourself. Don't ignore symptoms or let anyone dismiss what you're feeling. Believing her instincts saved her life.

For more than 12 years, Kim has been living with an irregular heartbeat. When symptoms first appeared, her heart would pause then follow by a strong beat, she didn't know what was happening. Although she's been to numerous appointments and has undergone many tests, the cause of Kim's arrhythmia remains unexplained. Instead of focusing on the unknown, Kim focuses on what she can control: a heart-healthy diet, giving up caffeine and working closely with her medical team to manage symptoms and medication. Her message to other women is to advocate for your health. Never let anyone minimize your journey or talk you out of caring for your well-being.




